## **Saltas Re-elected Grand President of Daughters of Penelope**

### ***Salt Lake City Native, Retired Educator Re-elected***

**WASHINGTON (August 28, 2013)**—Delegates of the Daughters of Penelope (DOP), a preeminent international women’s organization, re-elected Joanne Saltas, Salt Lake City, Utah, to be their Grand President for the 2013-14 administrative year. Elections were held August 23, 2013 at the 91<sup>st</sup> Annual AHEPA Family Supreme Convention in Orlando, Fla.

“It is humbling to be re-elected Grand President,” said Saltas, who is a member of Charai Chapter 79, Salt Lake City. “I look forward to continuing our work with the Grand Lodge and the membership to take our existing successful programs in education, philanthropy, and social services to greater levels to the benefit of the community.”

Saltas, a 39-year member of the Daughters of Penelope, has served all major positions at national, district, and chapter levels within the organization, including Grand Vice-President and all offices at the Grand Lodge level. In 2007, she was selected as National Penelope of the Year.

“I believe strongly in the philosophy of our organization’s founder, Alexandra Apostolides, who championed empowering women to be strong advocates for others and encouraged women to pursue ways to serve the broader community,” Saltas said. “The Daughters of Penelope provides these invaluable opportunities.”

The grand president was born and raised in Salt Lake City, Utah. She is a graduate of the University of Utah with a Bachelor of Science degree in secondary education and a Master’s degree in Computer Science. Although Saltas is now retired after a 30-year teaching career, she currently does part-time work for the University of Utah School of Medicine.

Saltas is also active in other community organizations. She is a member of the Philoptochos, and she is a past president of the local Pan Arcadian chapter.
