Elections were held July 27, 2016 at the 94th Annual AHEPA Family Supreme Convention, Las Vegas, Nev.

Professionally, Grand President Spanos is a government employee in Sacramento. Formerly, she was employed by an international products company headquartered in Brussels, Belgium where Spanos traveled extensively to several countries, states and cities as an educator and platform presenter.
